



The Big Chill

The marriage of an unused space and an existing wine-storage spot spawned an expansive walk-through wine room with a sophisticated appearance.

This nicety came about after the homeowners found they were not making use of a service bar, says interior designer Donna Vallone. That amenity was torn out, and the footage that was gained doubled the original wine room's size.

The designer, an Allied Member of ASID, notes that an existing vaulted barrel ceiling was extended to cover the additional space, and new

custom doors were added where there had been none. These richly detailed wood-and-glass doors (foreground) are located on a hallway side of the space. Doors at the far end of the wine room lead to an adjacent dining room vestibule.

The entire ceiling was clad in terra-cotta tiles, and decorative woodwork was installed to enhance shelving, which now can accommodate about 900 bottles of wine.
